Member States must also rapidly increase investment in the following areas:

The R&D pipeline, including local manufacturing of sustainable, appropriate health equipment and technology, particularly for low-resource settings; Global supply capacity for infection prevention and control measures, like medicines for climate-associated vector-borne diseases; and Access to safe and sustainable water, sanitation, and hygiene.

These investments are necessary to uphold the promises of the Paris Agreement and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, and must be urgently undertaken and with meaningful civil society engagement. As the proposed resolution on climate change and health is considered at this World Health Assembly, we urge all Member States to adopt it in its most robust and ambitious form.
